Richmond-Area Middle School Students Gather to "Break the Cycle" of Bullying & Prejudice

Over 250 Students, educators, and volunteers to participate in the 16th Annual Prejudice Awareness Summit

What: 16th Annual Prejudice Awareness Summit

When: Thursday, October 20, 2016 from 8:30 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

Where: Virginia Commonwealth University, Harris Hall, 1015 Floyd Avenue (Corner of Harrison and Floyd), Richmond, VA

Who: This year, over 200 middle school students and educators from 27 Richmond-area public and private middle schools, including schools from Richmond City, Chesterfield, Goochland, Henrico, and New Kent Counties will participate in discussions and activities around diversity, discrimination, and respect.

How: Students will participate in "Break the Cycle: Be the Change," a fast-paced, interactive presentation that examines the concept of prejudice. Using concepts from the presentation, students will break into teams to develop achievable and concrete solutions to the tough challenges that they face at school each day. Students will identify resources, allies, and timelines to achieve change while also spreading the PAS message to their larger middle school body. Students will return empowered and skilled agents of change and unity, with the goal to reduce conflict and prejudice in their schools.
