### --- PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: DIVERSITY DIALOGUE DAY ---

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual "Diversity Dialogue Day" program will be held for VCIC's Lynchburg and Tidewater chapters this spring. Diversity Dialogue Day will take place on March 8 at Lynchburg College for the Greater Lynchburg area high schools and on March 10 at Old Dominion University for Tidewater area high schools. The 2011 theme is "Addressing Bullying in Schools." Diversity Dialogue Day will take the students through an experience of awareness to action, specifically focusing on how stereotypes affect their school environments. Each high school is invited to bring 15 students and 1-2 educators at no cost. The Action Plan Profile highlights activities taking place in Virginia high schools that advance Inclusive Communities' work. As you hold programs in your school throughout the year, please share information about them to be included in future monthly email updates! This month, we profile the students from L. Douglas Wilder Middle School in Henrico who sent a delegation of students to the Prejudice Awareness Summit (PAS) in October. As part of PAS, the students developed an action plan focused on the issue of bullying at their school. When returning from PAS, they worked with educators and administrators to develop a "Words Hurt Website" where students can anonymously report cases of bullying and gang related activity. Selected faculty members receive each anonymous message and respond appropriately. Congratulations to the students at Wilder Middle School on the success of their action plan!
