Founded in 1866, St. Mark's Episcopal Church is celebrating its 150th year. As a result of its long-standing core values, St. Mark's holds a number of historical distinctions: became the first integrated Episcopal church (1967) in the city of Richmond; helped found the Richmond AIDS Ministry and ministered to AIDS victims at a time when no one else would; among the first Episcopal churches in the nation to perform ceremonies for all couples, and in 2016, is a host for both civil and sacramental weddings for all couples.
