### Transgender Community:

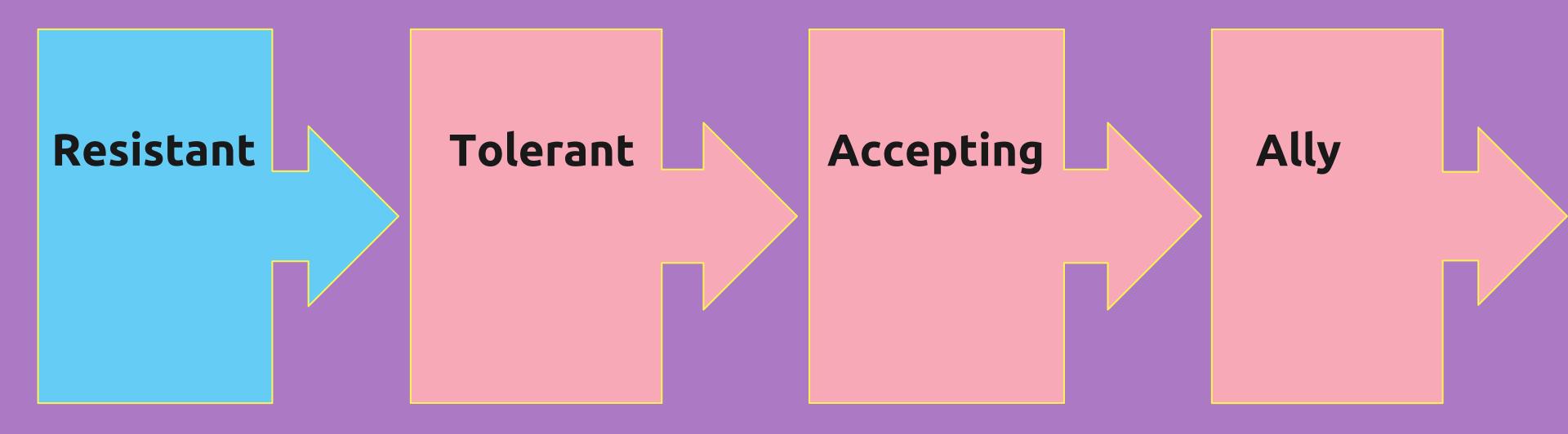

Refers to the belief that heterosexuality is the norm and all individuals are expected to conform to traditional gender roles and relationships.

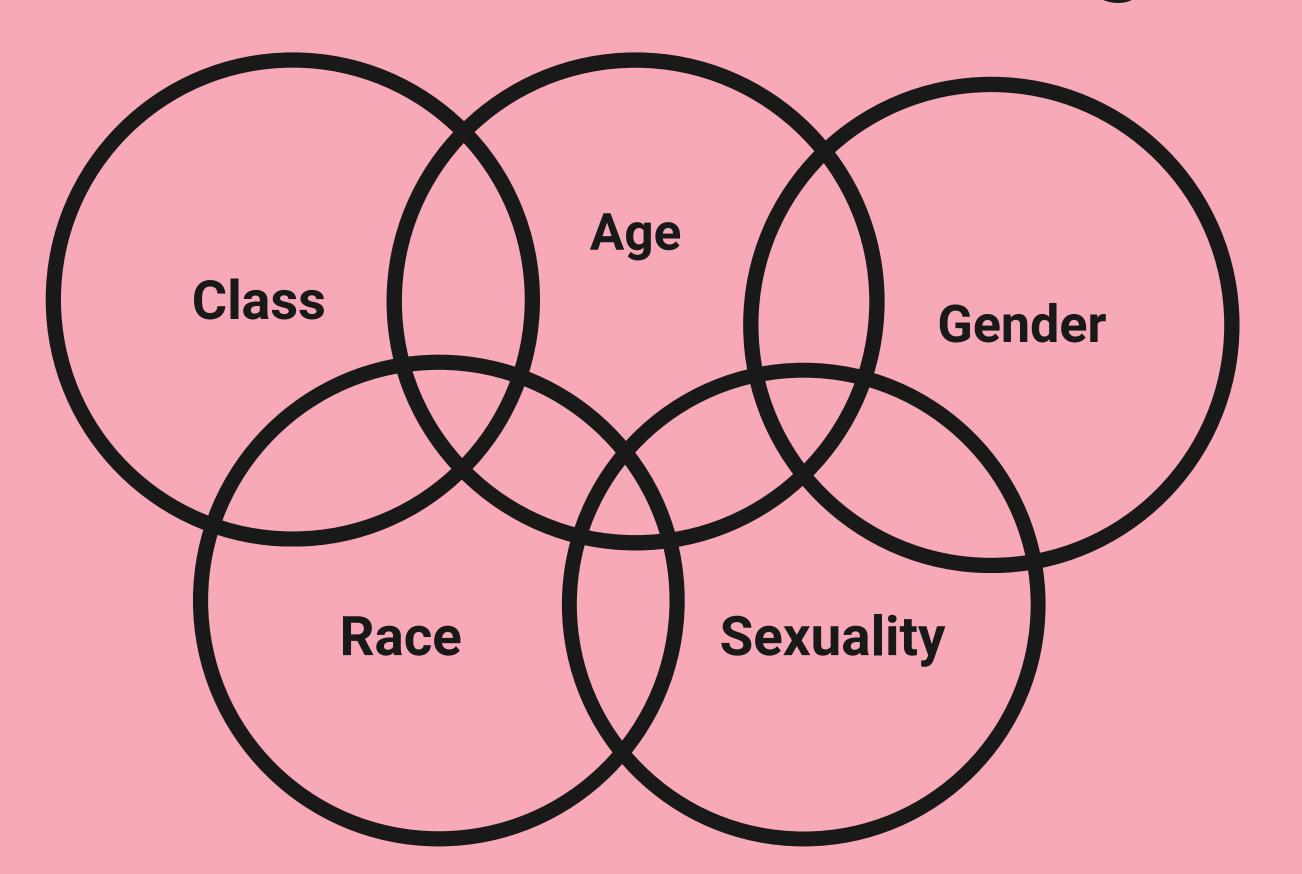

## Sex Assigned at Birth

Sex Assigned

- Based on our physical bodies
- Two main categories male or female.
- Research shows human bodies are on a spectrum of diversity.
  - Mirroring animals like seahorses
- Intersex bodies who do not fit into the two dominant categories.



## Gender Identity



- **Gender Identity** internal understanding of ourselves.
- How we feel in heart, mind, and soul
- Man, woman or girl, boy.
- Not same as sex assigned at birth.
- Socially constructed changes across communities and cultures.
- Massive spectrum of gender identities

## Exploring Identities

Cisgender: cis means same

A term used to describe a person whose gender identity aligns with those typically associated with the sex assigned to them at birth.

## Exploring Identities

**Transgender:** An umbrella term for people whose gender identity is different from cultural expectations based on the sex they were assigned at birth.

- Transgender folks can have various sexual identities.
- Trans people can identify as straight, gay, lesbian, bisexual, etc.

# Non-Binary Explored

- Someone whose identity does not fit into the binary.
- Someone who feels they float or exist between boy and girl.
- Someone who feels they are a combination of both man and woman.
- Someone who wants the freedom or exploration to create a new gender experience.



You do not have to fully understand someone's identity to respect them as a human.

# Gender Expression



- Gender Expression ways we dress, present, express ourselves.
- Does not have to align with gender identity.
- Folks whose gender expression is outside
   society expectation = more harassment
- Gender expression **does not** determine sexual orientation.

### Risk Factors

Nearly 1 in 3 LGBTQ young people said their mental health was poor most of the time or always due to anti-LGBTQ policies and legislation.

Nearly 2 in 3 LGBTQ young people said that hearing about potential state or local laws banning people from discussing LGBTQ people at school made their mental health a lot worse.

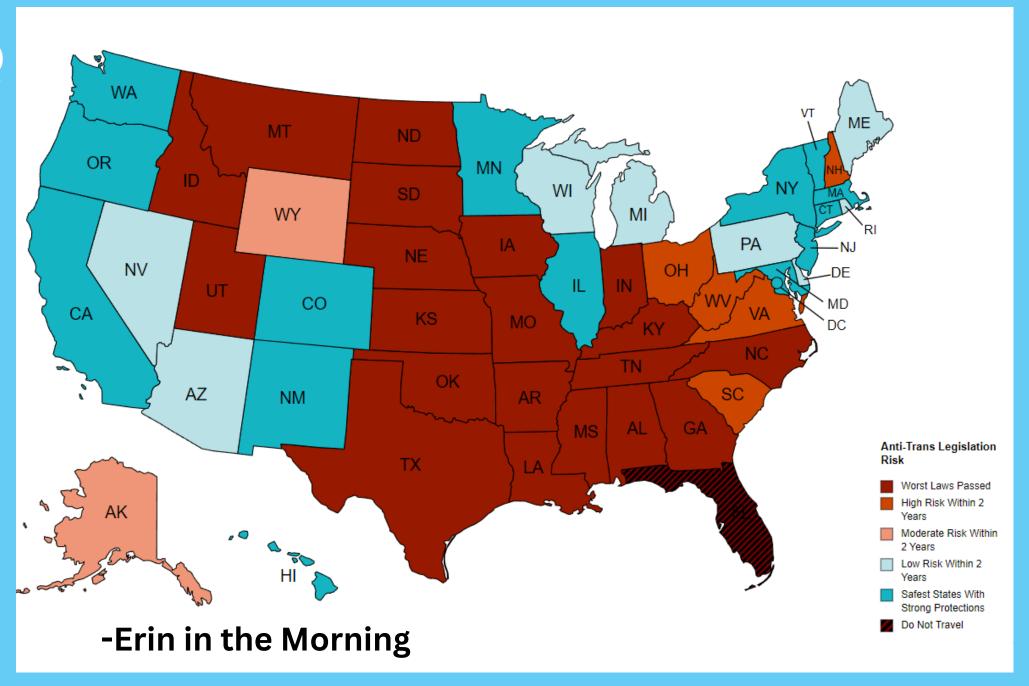
### Issues of Safety and Accessibility

Legislation: more than 550 anti LGBTQ bills introduced.

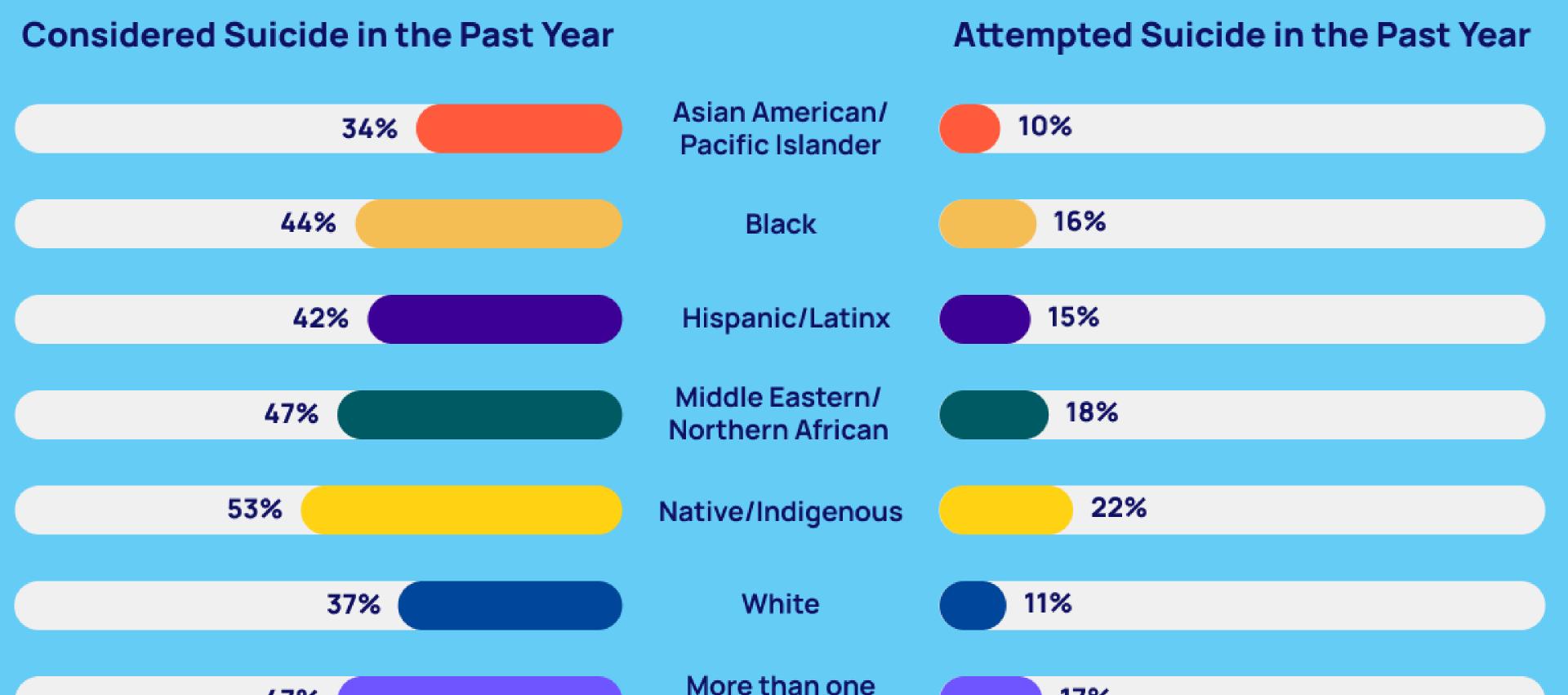
Most were aimed at trans youth

- gender-affirming healthcare
- books with LGBTQ characters
- books with Black History
- public accommodations: bathrooms
- legal document updates

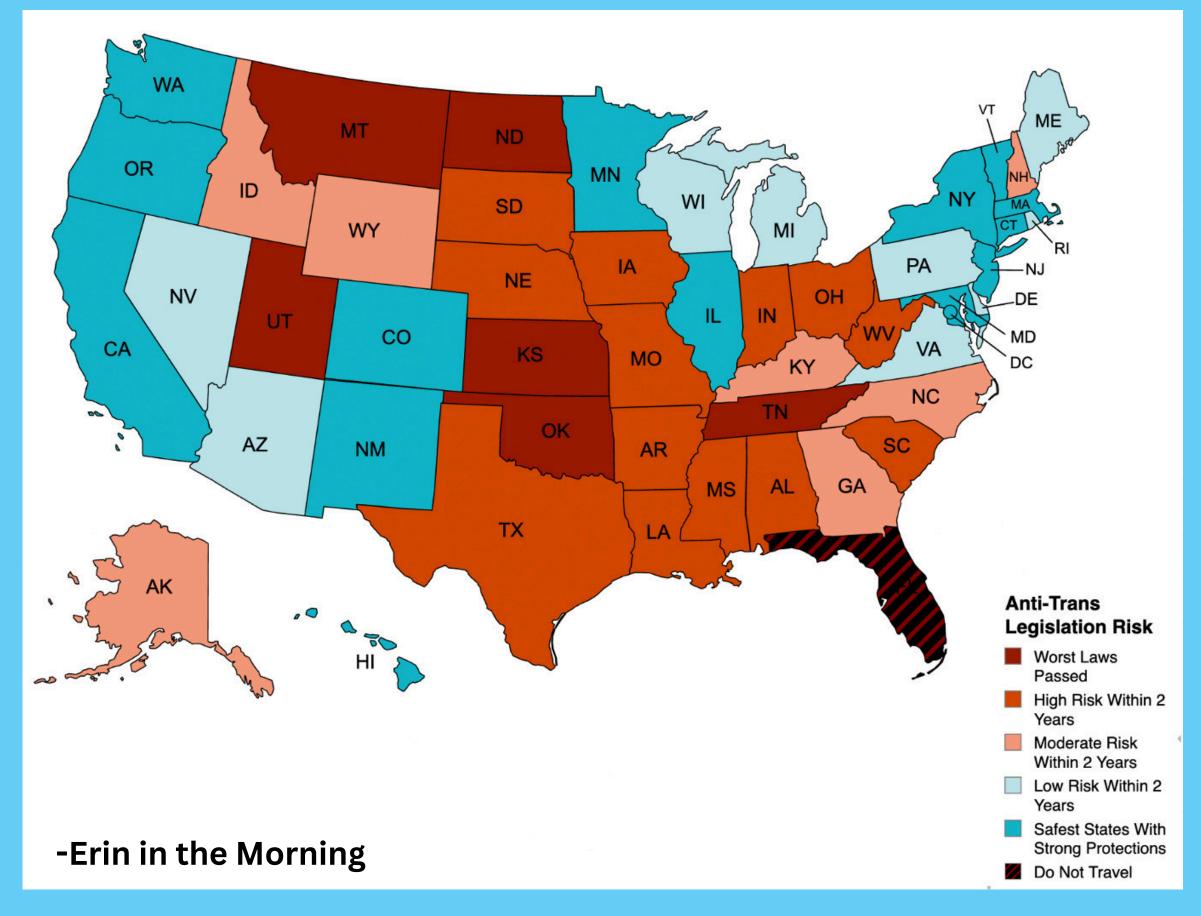


### Risk Factors for Adults

- Discrimination at the workplace
- Discrimination when applying for housing and credit
- Discrimination in public spaces
- Lack of legal protection
- Restricted access to gender affirming care
- Restricted access to update legal documents

### Protective Factors

Parents and families have been shown to be the greatest protective factor for LGBTQ+ youth, specifically trans and nonbinary youth.

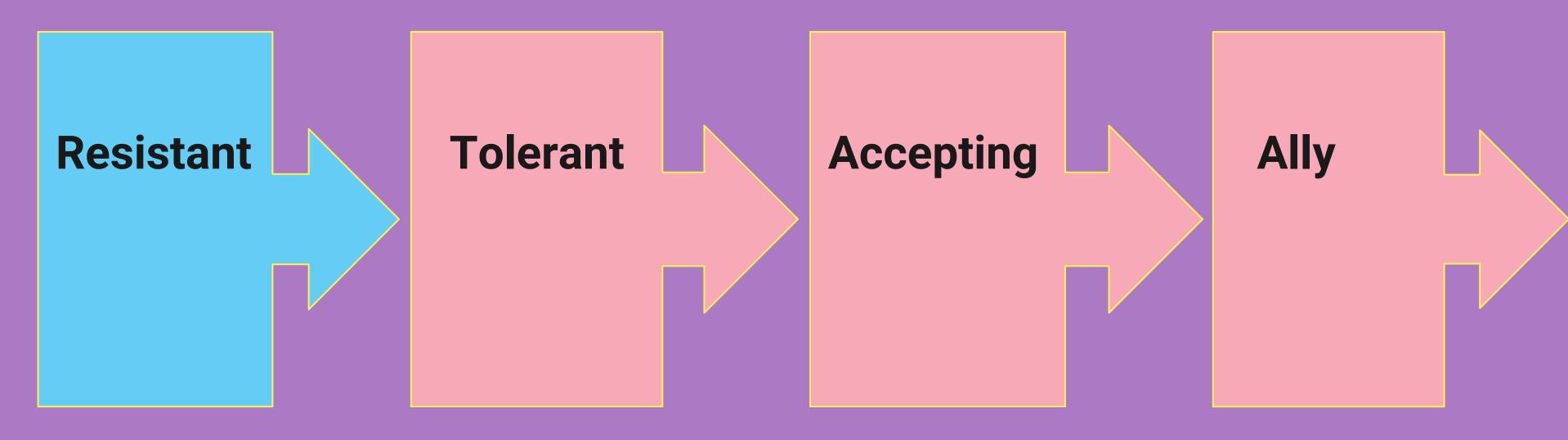
A supportive community and workplace can be a protective factor for youth and adults.

### Protective Factors

Affirming a trans person's chosen name and pronouns consistently at home, school, work, and in community experience:

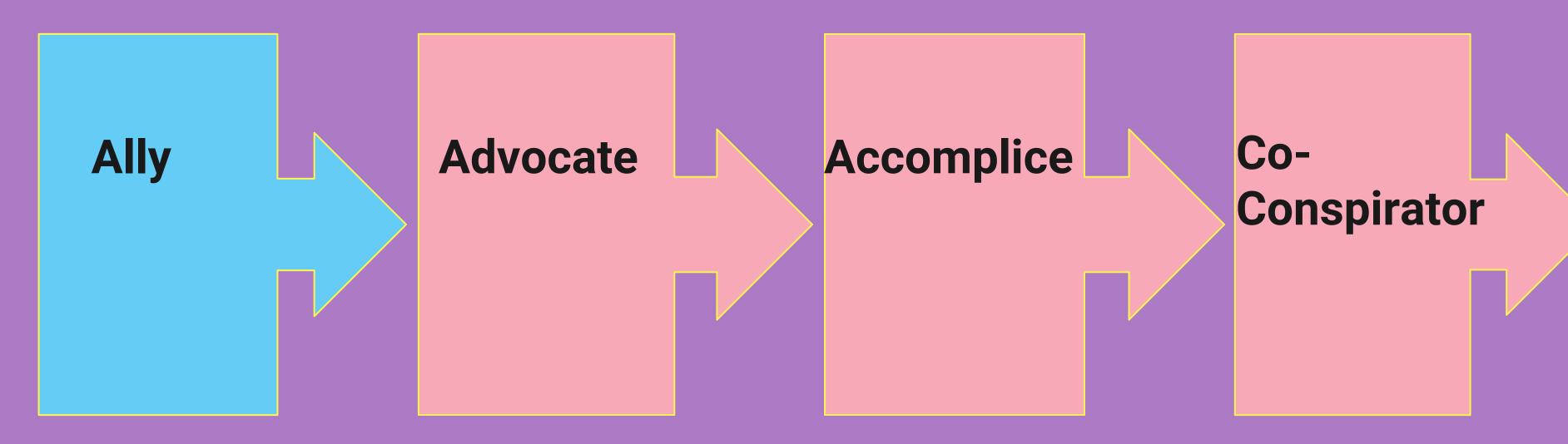
71% fewer symptoms of severe depression
34% decrease in reported thoughts of suicide
65% decrease in suicidal attempts

# Honor chosen names o don't misgender

- - If you do: own it, apologize, move on
- Ask their name and practice until you can say it



Pronouns - they/them; he/him, she/her + more

• Introduce yourself using your pronouns first

- Don't assume gender
  - pause
  - nuanced approach

- **Respect their privacy** 
  - It is their story to share

### Language Matters

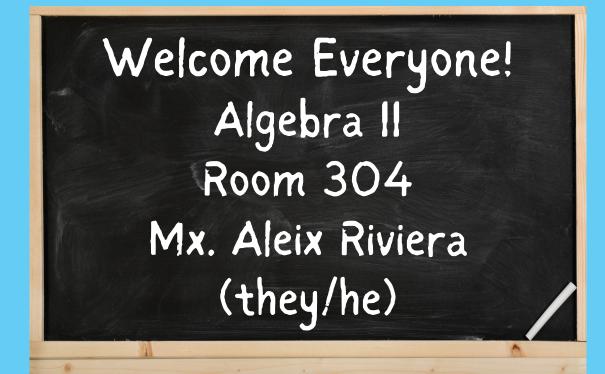


Keep it Gender Neutral

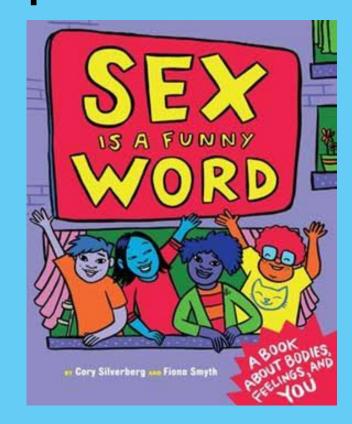
# Treat others the way THEY want to be treated!
